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119. Approval of items over £5,000 and consideration of any virement

120. Budget 2016/17, Precept report and leaflet

- **Resolved:** (1) to accept the recommendation of the Finance and Personnel Committee of a precept figure of £179,900 which would represent a 2% (£1.93) increase on a Band D council tax property;
 - (2) to accept the recommendation of the Finance and Personnel Committee that the precept leaflet (attached as Appendix 4 of the F&P Minutes of 20/1/16) be agreed.
 - (3) To confirm the agreement of the final budget 2016/17 as circulated with the agenda.

121. Feedback from the Westfield Neighbourhood Plan Working Group

Cllrs were advised that the Household survey had been commissioned and will be going out to residents shortly.

The Council noted that the next meeting was 2nd February 2016.

122. Gateway Sign to Westfield

Councillors discussed the gateway sign to Westfield at the Centurion roundabout.

Resolved:

- (1) to order the sign to read 'Westfield welcomes careful drivers. A community committed to education and enterprise' and to position the new sign on the grass verge at the top of the Fosseway, leaving space for a flower container to possibly be added at a later date:
- (2) the sign to have removable bar for advertising events in Westfield;
- (3) the colour of sign to be light brown;
- (4) to contact Stefan Chiffers of BaNES to discuss the positioning and style of the sign at the entrance from Radstock.

123. Flowers in Public Places

It was noted that WAGS is no longer able to undertake the planting of flowers in public places. The Potting Shed had been contacted, but had not yet

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responded. It was suggested that the College and Fosse Way School also be contacted.

Resolved: A working group to be established to purchase plants and

commission a voluntary group to assist with planting and

maintenance.

124. Outside Bodies Reports

Radstock Museum Society - It was reported that Cllr Seaman-Moss had received a letter inviting her to a meeting. Cllr Jackson reported that there will be a meeting of Trustees on Thursday to discuss funding for the museum clock.

125. Chairman's Report

Cllr Moss reported a Council Tax increase of 3.25% from BaNES He reminded Councillors that there is to be a mayoral election for BaNESin March, and, that further to Government announcing devolution changes, there will also be a mayor of 'Avon'.

Cllrs Moss and Jackson have visited Mardons and been shown the area that Linden Homes are applying to convert from offices to residential flats. They have started a discussion within BaNES and will be objecting to the planning request, when it comes in, on several levels, pointing out that the space was supposed to be an asset to the community.

126. Bath and North East Somerset Councillors' report

Cllr Jackson reported on the Select Committee for Wellbeing who failed to hold the Clinical Commissioning Group to account for a budgeting gap. She is in conversation with Sam Plummer regarding provision of Youth Services in Westffield. Mr Plummer is to attend E&D on 8th February. Cllr Jackson has also become the BaNES representative on the Religious Education Planning Committee
