28. EVENTS

Fun fair feedback

The issues around the organisation of the fun fair were discussed, recognizing that on the whole it had been a successful event for Westfield once again.

Resolved: (1) To ban the giving of goldfish as prizes at future events.

(2) To meet with Shaun Rogers well in advance of the fair next year, outlining everything needed from him in order to put the event on, including risk assessments for the stalls.

Fun Day feedback

Cllr Hopkins proposed a vote of thanks to Cllrs Wilkinson and Cooper for their work on the event. The day was considered a success, in spite of the weather. Unfortunately the dog show had to be cancelled due to the rain, but all other ring events went ahead.

Resolved: To write a letter to the Midsomer Norton and Radstock Silver Band expressing disappointment that they weren't able to perform for longer.

29. FRONT GARDEN COMPETITION

Councillors were reminded that they can nominate gardens in Westfield that they notice as being worthy of entry to the competition. Forms were distributed for the purpose.

30. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT POLICY AND ACTION PLAN

Resolved: To recommend to Council on 3rd July that the Community Engagement Policy and Action Plan be agreed, with the addition of the Front Garden Competition as community engagement.

31. YOUTH SERVICE PLANS (Cllr Jackson)
