66. RECREATION GROUND - NORTON HILL

69. PUBLIC ACCESS TO SNAILS BROOK

A report was given by the Clerk on the Parish Council's request that a modification order is made to make access to Snails Brook a public right of way. Historical evidence in the form of the roadway being marked as such on a map was had not been found. As an alternative to historic evidence, user evidence forms would need to be completed. It was suggested that we use social media to ask residents to provide us with evidence of historical and constant use.

Resolved: (1) not to purchase the signage outlining this as a permissive right of way.

(2) to investigate asking residents if they have evidence of historical use of the pathway by use of social media.
