Radstock Museum – ‘By Gone Days’ lectures continue to take place. As always, there is an appeal for volunteers. The museum is curating an exhibition which will take place next year about miners. Cllr Jackson will forward the newsletter.

Mardons – Cllr Cooper reported that the committee were due to meet with Police and Crime Commissioner Clare Moody during her recent visit to Westfield however this did not go ahead as Clare Moody’s visit was cut short. Cllr Cooper has requested that the committee send any questions they have for Clare Moody to the Parish Council so that these can be addressed at the meeting with Clare on 7th November.

Westfield In Bloom – Cllr Jackson reported on the recent success in this year’s awards. The allotment society, Westfield Primary School and Fosseyway School were all awarded Outstanding. Westfield Primary School are now recognised as a Champion School within B&NES.

Cllr Jackson reported:

- I have missed a number of my regular 'surgeries' at Trinity Methodist Church, most recently because of fund-raising events in the afternoon meaning the hall was shut mornings.
- I have been busy with Westfield in Bloom, which I believe is very important for creating community cohesion, identity and morale.
- Unfortunately, the Local Plan process has been halted, which makes Westfield vulnerable to speculative developments I did my best to represent your views individually at the Planning Inspector's Enquiry into the Curo application.
- We should see the consultation process of the RADCO site begin in January.
- I have devoted a lot of time to the recent Police and Crime Commissioner's visit. She met Sam Plummer of Youth Connect South West, who spoke highly of our support and the work he was endeavouring to do in Westfield

- 1) The Parish Council agreed architect fees in the amount of £950 for planning drawings and application for planning approval + £950 to revise drawings and specs for Building Control and tender submission.
- 2) When meeting with the Architect, we touched on the possibility of demolishing the existing building and re-building as a stand-alone structure on the same footprint from scratch. The Parish Council agreed to go ahead with this option.
- 3) The Clerk to arrange another meeting with the Architect to iron out all the items they require in order to write a spec.
- 4) The Funding Matrix was noted and it was agreed to fund from reserves and grants with the balance via a PWLB loan of 15 to 20 years.
